Welcome to our club. We have created this document and included others you should read in order to get the most enjoyment in a safe and friendly manner from your membership.

- CVMRCC has approximately 100 members from around the county.
- We welcome anyone young and old to join and have some fun.
- We fly within the AMA safety code.
- Our web site is www.cvmrcc.com. Our official Facebook page is [Chula Vista Model & Radio Control Club](#). You can check in there for club event dates, news, forum, etc. A monthly newsletter is sent by email about a week before our monthly meetings, held on the first Saturday of each month at 10 AM at the field, barring rain.
- Flight procedure is elaborated in the club Flight Operations & Safety Rules (FOSR's, included. Be sure to read this document.)
- Please read and observe all the safety rules of our club. They are posted on the fence and are in this email. Particularly the FOSR's.
- Our flight instruction program is minimally staffed. Please contact Walter Kramer, a board member listed on all club emails, if you feel you can't perform the flight skill demonstration contained in the FOSR, and he will help match you with someone who can assist in your training. All new members are required to demonstrate their flying proficiency for safety purposes in accordance with the FOSR section 5 Solo Requirements before they will receive their membership badge and be allowed to fly solo. Contact Walter Kramer, Membership Director, to schedule your demonstration. If you strictly fly multirotors, we do not have proficiency requirements developed for those yet, but you must be familiar with airspace and runway use and etiquette so you can safely fly with other aircraft.
- Spectators should park away from the pit area where the metal I-beams are located to allow for pilots to pit their aircraft.
- Trash cans are provided and depositing your trash in them is required. EXCEPT take your crashed planes and bad batteries home for disposal. (And no airplane shipping boxes. Yes, I had to mention it...)
- Monday through Friday (Except holidays) you MUST call Ream Field (Phone number on fence) per our LOA and FOSR.(Included in this welcome package)
- All new members must take the training course at [CVMRCC LOA ELearning Course](#)
- Due to our location, the Border Patrol frequents our area. If you must go into the field farther North than the creek or farther East than the power lines, you must call the Border Patrol at (619)628-2900, ask for the duty officer, and explain you are from CVMRCC and what you are doing and where, or you may get some unwanted attention. No cars are permitted further East than our parking lot. They are very friendly and cooperative, and
- have brought in lost planes on occasion.
